Dated the fifth day of December 1857. Whereas, The above bounden Susan Walden and Albert J. Myer have applied to the Surrogate Court of Erie county, for letters of Administration on all and singular, the goods, chattels and credits of Ebenezer Walden, late of the said town of Hamburg deceased. The condition of this obligation is such that, if the said Susan Walden, and Albert J. Myer shall well and faithfully execute the trusts reposed in them as Administrators, and Administration as aforesaid, and shall obey all orders of the Surrogate of Erie County, touching the administration of the Estate committed to them, then this bond to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
